ORDINARY TIME TE WĀ NOA

Pastoral Notes: Masses *ad libitum*

The *Roman Missal* does not provide proper Mass texts for the weekdays in Ordinary Time, unless otherwise indicated for the Proper of Saints.

On weekdays in Ordinary Time the priest may choose the Mass texts from:

- the previous Sunday in Ordinary Time,
- any other Sunday in Ordinary Time,
- a Saint inscribed in the martyrology for that day with texts from the suitable Common,
- a Mass for Various Needs and Occasions,
- a Votive Mass,
- a Mass for the Dead.

“In this way a richer collection of texts is provided, by which the prayer of the faithful is more abundantly nourished (*GIRM* 363).”

For Masses *ad libitum*, the *Aotearoa New Zealand Ordo* will indicate two references:

- first the Mass texts as given for the previous Sunday in Ordinary Time (the first option above);
- second, the Mass texts for any other Sundays in Ordinary Time (the second option above).

For example, Tuesday, 9 January 2018 (see p. 48) is the Tuesday of Week 1 of Ordinary Time. Looking at the Collect, the Prayer over the Offerings and the Prayer after Communion, there are two references given:

- the first reference indicates the Mass texts for the 1st Sunday in Ordinary Time (the first option above);
- the second reference indicates the Mass texts for the 9th Sunday in Ordinary Time (the second option above) - the date of the weekday is the 9th of the month ...

This will offer the priest, if he wishes, a variety of Mass texts for the weekday Masses instead of only repeating the Mass texts of the previous Sunday.

Sin and the Christian

By their very creation, human beings are called into relationships: with God, with one another, with oneself, with the whole of creation. Sin occurs when we choose to act in ways that rupture these relationships. The biblical stories in the early part of Genesis illustrate sin and its effects from the beginnings of human history. Original sin brought about for human beings a state of being alienated from God, from one another, within themselves and even with the rest of creation. The stories of Genesis chapters 3-11 illustrate these effects of sin in the human community. The prevailing sinfulness makes it easy for individuals to sin personally and to co-operate in, or at least tolerate the structures of sin often set up in society.

NOTES:

LENT is the yearly celebration by the Church of its corporate conversion in Jesus Christ. During Lent, the liturgy prepares catechumens to celebrate the Paschal Mystery through the various stages of Christian initiation.

LENT also prepares the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery as they recall their baptism and do penance in preparation for the greatest feast of the year.

THE TIME OF LENT TE WĀ O RENETI

The ALLELUIA & the GLORIA are always omitted in Lent. During the Lenten Offices, the Te Deum is said only when indicated.

PASTORAL NOTES - LENT

Purpose: Lent is a season of repentance and conversion, as the Church anticipates her celebration of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is also the season of preparation to be baptised and confirmed and/or renewing one's baptismal promises at the Paschal Vigil on Easter Sunday.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts 40 days. These 40 days parallel the journey of the people of Israel through the desert to the promised land and Jesus' time of temptation in the desert. Lent ends before the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

The penitential and baptismal aspects of Lent give rise to many of our customs and practices.

The Paschal fast begins after the Mass of Holy Thursday and ends at the Paschal Vigil.

Colour: The colour used during Lent is predominantly violet, a reddish purple, reminding us of the blood shed by Jesus during His Passion and Death. This colour was worn by a conquering general in the victory parade through Rome, thus it reminds us of the victory of the Cross.

Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week introduces the colour red.

Environment: The environment reflects a tone of solemnity and sombreness, avoiding the use of flowers for decoration.

Lavish use of green palms on Palm Sunday, with touches of red, marks the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem and points towards the Triduum, the Three Great Days that mark the transition from Lent to Easter. The palms should be removed after Vespers on Palm Sunday.

Music: Lenten music is marked by the characteristics of this season, a season of repentance and conversion. The *Alleluia* and *Gloria* are omitted. As the organ should be silent, or used only to support the singing, so other musical accompaniment (eg. guitars, pianos, etc.), should be only loud enough to provide for the singing of the Assembly.

People might be asked to gather and leave some Masses in silence. In this, the Church's exuberance at Masses of Easter Sunday will abound among the faithful.

Music specific to the rituals for catechumens and candidates preparing to enter the Church at Easter needs consideration, as does the ritual music for the Triduum.

Palm Sunday, the last Sunday of Lent, requires "Hosannas"! A song using "Hosannas" and the phrase "Son of David" should be used as the ministers approach the place where the people have gathered for the Procession to the Church.

Symbols:

- **Ashes** on Ash Wednesday are a symbol of our will to be converted and to do penance when faced with the forgiveness offered by Jesus. Ashes are made from the olive branches or branches of other trees that were blessed the previous year. The ashes are placed on the forehead with the words "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."
- **Palms** on Palm Sunday remind us of the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem but also of the week to come - the days of Holy Week.

In New Zealand we are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
